

# WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

The 2020-2021 League Year has undoubtedly been different from others before it, but the Junior League of Portland (JLP) members have prevailed and shown resilience and grace under extraordinary circumstances. Our theme for the year is "Better Together", and never has a theme rung so true or so needed, as we continue to be physically apart. JLP members' commitment to the organization, goals, each other and our community are as strong as they have ever been.



This summer, we welcomed our new Provisional class with an interactive and fun virtual brunch. Our Learning and Development "Virtual Excellence" series have continued to have great offerings and this team also launched the JLP Learning Institute, a two year certification program that teaches the fundamentals of nonprofit board service, with an astounding 20 percent of Active and Provisional members signing a letter of intent to complete the program.

The murders of Breonna Taylor, George Floyd and countless others struck a chord deep within our community. We recognized that we had significant work to make our organization more inclusive for all members and dismantle systemic racism. In June, we formed the BIPOC Racial Justice Special Committee with the mission to elevate the voices and experiences of Black women, Indigenous women, and women of color within our organization and community, educate membership on systemic racism in our society and our League, communicate JLPs efforts to disrupt systemic racism and activate membership to do the same. I am proud to share that this committee has received an AJLI Accelerator Award this fall with a \$1,000 grant to further their efforts.

This year marks our 110 year anniversary of service to the Portland community and we celebrated despite the virtual format. The 110th Anniversary committee hosted several highly engaging virtual member experiences including baking a cake at home on our founder Gretchen Corbett's birthday led by JLP Sustainer and baker, Natalie Edwards. The virtual meeting was lively and full of laughter as members' children joined in the fun, new skills were learned and perhaps a few baking mishaps ensued. Although we were apart, we felt so together!

I hope you can see from the above that despite obstacles laid forth this year, our League members and organization continue to grow and flourish. Our commitment to our community and the development of our members remains steadfast. And when we come together, there is nothing we cannot accomplish. We truly are "Better Together".

# **110TH ANNIVERSARY**

2020 was a momentous year for many reasons and especially for the Junior League of Portland, as we celebrated the milestone of our 110th anniversary. Plans for the celebration of our 110th year were started back in 2015 when a group of current and future JLP presidents attended a conference in New Orleans together. Ideas for a revival of the 1910 Campaign paired with a new vehicle for fundraising swirled through our heads. Plans were outlined to highlight our role in the community for 110 years and to give back to a community partner in a big way.

As we know, many plans for 2020 have to be postponed or cancelled but a lot of the spirit that was originally created for our 110th anniversary was still celebrated this year. At the beginning of 2020, we brought media to our public events to showcase our efforts to the public. We hosted a storytelling event at Multnomah County Central Library and presented a gift to the Children's Book Bank honoring our legacy with children's literacy programs. The remainder of our celebrations were held virtually due to COVID-19. We successfully met our fundraising goal of \$110,000 and made a gift to New Avenues for Youth with a virtual check presentation! Several of our members enjoyed virtual BINGO, a dining-in cooking event featuring recipes from our cookbooks, a cake baking event on founder Gretchen Corbett's birthday (which is the day we typically celebrate our anniversaries) and JLP trivia night.

Our organization is not a stranger to challenges and triumphs and 2020 was no different. We have kept our heads high, celebrated in the best ways we can and weathered this pandemic with our badge of 110 years of excellence in our community.

# **BIPOC RACIAL JUSTICE SPECIAL COMMITTEE MISSION STATEMENT**

#### Approved November 5, 2020

The Junior League of Portland's Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) Racial Justice Special Committee was formed in response to the police killings of unarmed Black people in the United States. During our time together, we began to normalize complex conversations that made us all think, feel, empathize, and increase knowledge about BIPOC communities and their experiences.

The BIPOC Racial Justice Special Committee is a space where we can **elevate**, **educate**, **communicate** and **activate** our members - pushing each other to be disruptive change agents and contribute to systemic change within JLP and in our own communities.

Our commitment to our members is to consistently **do the work**: the work that provides opportunities to all, challenges us to grow, empowers members to share, and removes barriers that historically oppress Black, Indigenous, and People of Color.

We will lead from the front, being the change we want to see in the League.

The Essentials Drive kicked off in October 2020 and focuses on procuring donations for undergarments because individuals fleeing trafficking environments are often asked to surrender these items as evidence. Once safe, they may not have the resources to purchase new ones or additional essentials, like toiletries. The Junior League of Portland will distribute donations to a selection of partner organizations which provide immediate and long-term care to survivors, such as **Rose Haven**, **New Avenues for Youth**, **A Village for One, and Rahab's Sisters.**

# **LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE/JLPLI**

In the Fall of 2020, the Learning and Development Committee launched the first Junior League of Portland Learning Institute (JLPLI) certificate track course in Nonprofit Board Leadership.

The classes were offered to Active and Provisional members virtually, with an astounding 20% of League membership signing a Statement of Intent to participate and 45 members in attendance at the first class of the series. The JLPLI has been a dream of some JLP members for several years, and substantial work and preparation has gone into its creation.



Despite the many unexpected twists and turns of 2020, the JLPLI has come beautifully to fruition! Presenting this course connects the League to our past legacy of offering learning opportunities that served to prepare and promote members to serve their community beyond the League. We are thrilled at the prospect of sending trained Junior League of Portland members to serve on nonprofit boards throughout the Portland area.

We've so far enjoyed the expert instruction of current and former JLP members, including our current president, Gina Roman, former Secretary, Tina Penman, and current Treasurer, Elisa Spano. Members participating in the Certificate Track will attend eight classes over two League years, and present a case study to complete their certification.

# GINGERBREAD JAMBOREE 2020: GINGERBREAD JAMBOREE AT HOME

Now in its ninth year, Gingerbread Jamboree has become a treasured holiday tradition for so many in the Portland area, drawing JLP members and community members alike. After the 2019 event at the Sentinel Hotel brought a record attendance of more than 450 people, the planning committee did not want to lose any momentum in 2020. With all of the uncertainties surrounding COVID-19, the team quickly pivoted to a 100% virtual event with coordinated contact-less drops, and thus "Gingerbread Jamboree at Home" was born!




Complete with a brand new logo, our 2020 event was focused around selling curated gingerbread decorating kits that were delivered to participant's homes by a network of 35 volunteer elves on Saturday, December 12,2020. With two themed kits designed to delight kids and adults alike, each package provided a deluxe gingerbread house with all the trimmings, festive activity suggestions and themed playlists, design ideas, snacks and hot cocoa, and more. Exclusive Zoom Meet & Greets with Santa, Anna, and Elsa were also available to add to the fun, with 60 families



attending on Sunday, December 13, 2020. The adultfocused "Gingerbread After Dark" kit proved to be a welcome addition to the event lineup, attracting the attention of a local company who purchased kits for a happy hour activity with their employees.

Both kits sold out prior to the event, and the virtual event format proved to be more than profitable, with more than \$7,000 net revenue going back to support the Junior League's mission. Thanks to the generous support of our patrons, the League was also able to donate 12 kits to some of our partner organizations, including Rose Haven, Raphael House, and YWCA Clark County. The Gingerbread Jamboree committee is thrilled with the success of this year's event, and is excited to start planning for 2021!


